If any of the above information changes, it is the responsibility of the alarm user to immediately update in writing the information with the First Constable and/or Fire Chief for the Town of Killington. Furnish floor plans which indicate the location of the key lock box (Knox Box), alarm control panel, main electrical panel, gas and/or oil storage tanks, any hazardous or flammable materials and such other information as may be pertinent to emergency service responders. (See attached sheet for more explanation)

Should all of the above information not be provided, the system shall be considered an Unregistered alarm and shall be subject to penalties for same. This form is for the Town of Killington. A separate form must ALSO be filed with the Vermont State Police for Burglar alarm systems.

This is to help in understanding Killington Town False Alarm Ordinance "Registration" Section 6.1 a-h. What we are looking for is a style like you see on the back of a hotel room door saying you are here. Also we would ask if the owner could supply their plan both in its printed format (8x11 size) and in AutoCAD or Cad file format. Our second choice would be a ".DWG" file extension or third a ".DXF" on disk labeled for the structure. It would be helpful if JPEG format pictures of the structure and important features the department would be looking for could be put on the disk. Both floor plans and pictures would be of great value in preplanning for the department.

The plan must show the road in reference to the building.

Plan to include but not limited to:

1. Outside building dimensions (over all length and width do not need ever corner)
2. Floor plan for each floor showing hallways etc.
3. Location of the following:
 - a. Alarm panel - main
 - b. Alarm panel - sub panel
 - c. Main electric shut off
 - d. Sub electric shut off (if the main does not control the entire building)
 - e. Gas and or oil storage tanks - location, size and shut offs and 24hr contact information for the supplying company
 - f. Knox box location
 - g. Knox box minimum content:
 - i. Keys to all locatable doors
 - ii. Codes to silence fire alarm in sealed envelope
 - iii. Name and phone number(s) of 24 hr contact(s)
 - h. Fire department water connection
 - i. Closest fire hydrants or water source
 - j. Note if building uses floor trusses (commercial state code requires signage outside on building)
 - k. Note if building uses roof trusses (commercial state code requires signage outside on building)
 - l. Any hazardous or flammable materials storage location and amount noted
 - m. Any other information as may be pertinent to emergency service responders

Not every building will have all of the above and some could have more.

The purpose of this information is to help the department personal in responding to your property and being able to locate things in a timely manor. It is very important to include everything that is pertinent to your property.
