The meeting was called to order at 7:25 PM.

**RECREATION DIRECTOR UPDATE:**

The pool opened a week early with over 100 people using the facility on Saturday, June 28<sup>th</sup>. At this time we have 10 non-resident families as members. Kim has put in place new initiatives including the requirement that each family fill out an informational form and each family member will have a pass. Also all children under the age of six will pass a swim test or be required to wear a US approved life vest. Kim is also working with the life guards to have them be more interactive with visitors to the pool complex. She is also scheduling the lifeguard shifts and depending on the need can vary the number of guards on duty on a rotating basis. This will save us money and be fair to the lifeguards.

New summer activities include yoga by the pool. This is a free class introducing Power Yoga/Bikram Yoga scheduled for Wednesday mornings 9:45 to 10:45 AM with instructors Liz Patnode and Danielle Joaquin. Ultimate Frisbee for those 16 and over will be every Wednesday evening. An adult night will

include Kickball and Soccer. KMS is planning a free coed Lacrosse Basic Camp taught by the head coach.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

We have realized \$22,000 in camp revenues. The goal is \$25 to \$30 thousand. We are offering five scholarships with some of the needed dollars coming from the Chili Cook-Off. This fact should be included in the public information advertising the Cook-Off.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Eleven KAS (Killington Active Seniors) attended the Red Dot Celebration Lunch held at the Long Trail Brewery. The Killington Women's Club has donated \$250 to the KAS. In a conversation between Kristen Alf and Gerrie it was agreed that if there are children attending the elementary school with specific needs, such as participation in the ski program, the KAS could help with funds. These monies will go through Kim. A calendar will be prepared monthly with the KAS activities and be posted on the Recreation Department website. Joy Black served 74 lunches to the seniors at the Lookout during the month of May. She will receive a check for \$103.60 from the Recreation Department. For the record, Joy receives \$5 from each person attending, \$1.40 for each person from the recreation department and \$.85 for each person from the Southwestern Vermont Council on Aging, for a total of \$7.25 per lunch. Gerrie plans on meeting with Courtney Anderson from SVCOA in the near future to discuss future senior activities.

It was suggested that Gerrie send the minutes from each meeting to commission members a few days before each meeting.

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the commission will be Monday, July 11 at 7:00 PM.

On a motion by Andrew, seconded by Steve, the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 PM.
